Almighty God sovereignly foreordained the day of your birth and wrote it in lights against the backdrop of His heavenly masterpiece to declare your calling and potential for the whole world (and angels) to see.

In order to fully appreciate your Christological profile, it is necessary to understand how it was determined. (These are not smoke-and-mirrors and see-how-you-feel interpretations that come from mysticism.) For your message to produce the most impact, level 3 was designed to show you how the interpretation was derived.

A major difference between Christological astronomy and astrology is that the former zeroes in on the accurate constellation and location within your birth sky, whereas the latter is 31.9 degrees off. Christological astronomy is strikingly accurate with the movement of precession factored in. (It is possible that, in some ways, our computer program may even be more accurate than NASA's.)

The most ancient zodiacs have 48 constellations, consisting of 12 major ones and 36 minor (associated) ones. Each of the 12 major ones have three associated minor ones within their immediate vicinity, and each of those are related in meaning to the major one. These minor constellations are called decans or amplifiers. The name "decan" is derived from the Latin word for 10, so named because each of them is allotted one-third of 30 degrees (which equals 10 degrees) within the major constellation's ecliptic arc. Decans amplify and contribute to the message of their corresponding major constellation. Although the message is already displayed by the major constellation, its three surrounding decans/amplifiers add layers to it. It can be likened to a quartet, with the major constellation singing the melody and its three "back-up singers" (the decans) singing harmony. Although they may seem unnecessary, their presence is what adds vital detail to the particular aspects of your potential God-given messianic abilities.

Decans are read by dividing the major constellation's ecliptic path into three equal segments and finding the decan that is assigned to each portion. The first decan that rises over the eastern horizon relates to the first third, the second one rising over the eastern horizon is relative to the second portion, and the third one rising over the eastern horizon is assigned to the third portion. Each decan's meaning will contribute with hair-splitting accuracy a particular emphasis to your overall Christological profile. This is God's way of zooming in on His message of your potential calling and purpose, and it will enhance your appreciation of and faith in what the heavens declared about you when you were born.

In your birth sky, the positions of the Sun, Moon, and planets within your major constellations' decans add specific insight to your Christological profile; and level 3 provides these positions with pinpoint accuracy. It shows the specific decans (amplifiers) of each constellation, allowing a more accurate interpretation based upon the ancient star names within the decan as well as their proximity to your major constellation. As opposed to a random sampling of astrology websites on the Internet, ours is the only one that gave actual scientific data based upon astronomy rather than 2300-year-old obsolete astrological tables.

The greatest level of detailed accuracy in rendering a celestial interpretation is found when applying this technique of locating the specific decans within your constellation and applying its messianic significance. Interpreting decans is an ancient secret that only very few people in the world today have knowledge of. Another benefit of level 3 is the addition of scriptural numerics which adds an even greater understanding to decan interpretations.

Level 3 will also reveal an understanding of reading Earth, again a secret known to

only very few within the inner sanctum of celestial interpreters. We discovered this in the greatest book of secrets ever written—the Bible, in Psalm 19:5 and 6. Also included in this level is a detailed rendering of the Moon's location and its spiritual significance. The Moon is the second most revealing celestial sphere in the heavens, next to the Sun; and it deserves the attention it gets because it will help reveal the area(s) where you especially need to be steadfast and faithful.

Note: when more than one planet is located in a constellation, it intensifies the meaning-the more planets, the more the multiplication factor. Obviously, the sun's position is most important, and the moon is important too. (Genesis 1:16 says that these are the greater lights.) However, when multiple planets are in the same constellation, their messages are more emphasized.


Christological Astronomy Profile Report

The Sun

The location of the Sun is the most contributing factor in interpreting a Christological profile. The Sun is the only light in the solar system that has light of itself. Jesus referred to Himself as "the light of the world" in John 8:12 and 9:5. All other celestial bodies reflect the light of the Sun. The constellation that the Sun was in at the time of your birth shows certain traits and messianic characteristics that are potential within you. (Remember that the Sun's location is not the same as in horoscopes and astrology, due to precession.)

The Sun is a picture of Yeshua the Righteous One. Even though the righteousness of God is a gift and not to be earned, the location of the Sun will show your "righteous acts." These acts are what will accrue, during your earthly visitation, eternal rewards in your heavenly account. In other words, when God says, "Well done good and faithful servant," it will be a stamp of approval for fulfilling what the Sun said about you in your birth sky.



Meaning

Level One

- The Sun, the most dominant image of the heavens, resides in Gemini, the twins.
- Gemini has two major stars named for Messiah the King and the other for Messiah the Redeemer.
- This means you were called to be both kingly and loving; to be all things to all men.

The Sun in Gemini shows the righteousness of God fulfilled in both messianic aspects—the redeemer and the ruler. This shows the balance of being lover and fighter, lion and lamb, and encourager and leader. The two parts of Gemini are also prophetic of the bridegroom coming to rescue and claim His bride. This shows that God has made you to be all things to all men—to be a blessing to those who need it and/or an encouraging word for those who need that.

Level Two

In the Gemini constellation, more than most others, the specific location of the Sun or any planet is extremely important. On the right side (as you view it) the star with the Latin name of "Castor" is the bright star in the head of the King/Bridegroom/Conqueror. On the left side is the star "Pollux," so named in Latin, which is the side of the Redeemer/Bride/Rescuer. The position of the Sun or planet within the constellation is crucial to obtaining the deeper meaning. Some of the star names also add extra enlightenment when a planet is in close proximity to them. The Sun residing in Gemini shows that God has called you to be the balance of Messiah, both tender shepherd and ruling king.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

Decans are amplifiers of major constellations and the decans of Gemini are Lepus, Canis Major, and Canis Minor. Each decan contributes to the whole messianic message of Gemini. To really appreciate Gemini and to understand the mysteries of it, you must learn the lessons of the decans.

Gemini is one of more famous constellations because it is easy to find. Its ancient Coptic (Egyptian) name as well as its Hebrew name means "the united." The more modern name of Gemini means "twins" in Latin and is derived from its twin stars. In some zodiacs, the two characters (twins) are depicted as a man and woman, while others portray them as two young boys who are seated and holding weapons. It appears that they are rulers and warriors who are not presently engaged in war.

The two main stars of Gemini are named after the sons of Jupiter in mythology: Castor and Pollux in Latin, or Apollo and Hercules in Greek. The star names give greater details about the meaning of this constellation. The brighter one on the right side, from our perspective, is Castor, "the judge" and "ruler;" the slightly dimmer star to the left is Pollux. The Hebrew word for this dimmer star means "the redeemer who comes to suffer." Other stars in Gemini carry such meanings as "treading under foot," "the one appointed to rule," and "the redeemer afflicted." The overall meaning is unity as seen through the twin aspects of Messiah as Ruler/Redeemer, Son of God/Son of man, and the Lion/Lamb. The message of unity speaks of being amenable and negotiable; well balanced and not an extremist. A unifier also forgives and reconciles.

Although the common name attributed to this constellation deals with twins, the actual meaning of the two dominant stars is "the united." This is the messianic message continually portrayed through this constellation. It shows the united messianic characteristics of the ruler, the judge, and the rescuer. It means that Messiah is all things to all men and has a definite inference of being well balanced. The decan the Sun, Moon, or planet abides in will pinpoint the direction you lean or indicate if you too are well balanced in these areas. There are strong implications that this is an arbitrator or one who brings ideas and people together.

The decans assigned to amplify the meaning of Gemini are Lepus, Canis Major, and Canis Minor. The commonly known, modern pictures of all three decans are strongly influenced by mythology, portraying the dogs (Canis Major and Canis Minor) of the hunter (Orion) as

killing a rabbit (Lepus). However, while the analogy of attacking and killing is accurate, the star names reveal that the dogs are actually hawks and the rabbit is a snake. The star names show that the name of Canis Major would be the Rulership Hawk and Canis Minor would be the Redeemer Hawk. This is one of the consummate places of the heavens that show the Messiah as both King and Redeemer. It is fully shown by the twin stars of Gemini and now we can see how the meaning is derived from the decans as well. Both hawks, unified, are attacking the serpent (aka Lepus), while Orion stomps on it. This presents a three-pointed attack on evil. So the messianic trait of attacking evil is added to the unifier trait.

The star names paint an accurate picture, so we can reconstruct the deeper meanings to clearly see the messianic characteristics. In summary, Lepus communicates ruling over enemies and keeping them underfoot, Canis Major shows the messianic trait of the king and ruler, and Canis Minor represents messiah as rescuer or redeemer.

The second decan assigned to the ecliptic arc of Gemini is Canis Major. It has the brightest star of the heavens, called Sirius, which means "the prince comes." It is a testimony of the coming messiah and the star names show the virtue and characteristic of being a just ruler, as a coming prince, soon to become king and ruler. The fact that this decan intersects the two bodies of the twins, or the dividing line of the pair, shows that you can either lean to the left or to the right. The right side is the prince and the left side is the rescuer. You are one who can be both, like King Arthur—noble conqueror and just ruler.

Canis Major's name should probably be "Sirius" which means "the coming prince." The Egyptian name and picture that predates Greek mythology shows this to be a hawk coming down upon the serpent (properly supplied as Lepus, instead of a rabbit) that is under the foot of Orion. It shows a triple attack on the enemy from Orion (the subduer), Canis Major (the coming prince) and Canis Minor (the coming redeemer). So, don't forget that the meaning of Gemini and its decans is a violent message of peace through superior fire power. This is further confirmed by the two characters in Gemini holding weapons.

The Sun residing in the second decan of Gemini amplifies your traits as a noble ruler. This could relate to being a good boss or a great dad or mom. The heart of love that comes from the other side of Gemini (as the redeemer) also lives in you. This make you a compassionate leader, which is the best kind.


This is the messianic message of a coming prince; therefore practice being royal and thinking of yourself in this way. As a unifier, you can be all things to all men so that you can reach all levels of people, be it the king or the homeless addict. This is a great gift—reach out to all.

The Moon

The relevance of the Moon lies within its ability to reflect the light of the Sun, since it cannot shine of its own accord. Therefore, its implication within our Christological destiny is determined by the constellation that houses it on that date, since that impacts its reflected light. It is also continually changing within its phases, causing variations within that light. The Moon symbolizes our continual need to reflect Christ (the Sun); it may also indicate an area in our lives that requires extra strengthening from the Scriptures.

Although the Moon's positioning and reflected light on our birth date may reveal personal challenges, it should not be viewed negatively. It simply provides a key to help us reach our

Christlike potential portrayed in the heavens. It does this by revealing what we need to renew our minds to so that we more effectively reflect His glory.

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

Libra is the constellation of righteous judgments and required payments. In almost all zodiacs it is rendered as a pair of scales, meaning something needs to be weighed to see how much is owed. Payment must be made. This shows the messianic virtue of sacrifice. Sacrifice needs to be added to one side of the scale if justice is done. The names of the stars in Libra really agree with the decans associated with Libra (the Southern Cross, Victima, and Corona), and gives a total picture of being sacrificial for others, as Messiah is for all.

The first decan in Libra is the Southern Cross, also known by its Latin name, Crux. This rises above the eastern horizon before Libra's other decans, Victima (Lupus) and Corona (Corona Borealis). The Southern Cross (Crux) is one of the most interesting constellations in the heavens. It is in the extreme southern portion of the sky and really is in the form of a cross. It was visible from Jerusalem until precession moved it out of sight after the time of Jesus (Yeshua) of Nazareth. Many attribute this as a messianic sign of fulfillment of Yeshua of Nazareth as the Messiah.

Crux was also the decan in which the Moon resided when Jesus was born. Its location is specified in Scripture when Revelation 12:1 says that the Moon was under Virgo's feet. It does not say the Moon was in Virgo; it says it was under Virgo. Under Virgo is Libra and the first decan of Libra is Crux.

The meaning of Crux's principal star in Coptic (Egyptian) means "victory; triumph through a great conflict." Is this not what the meaning of the cross should be rather than an instrument of death? In the Old Hebrew alphabet, the letter tau is scripted as a "t" or a cross shape. It was the sign for victory in eternity, which is what was on Jesus' mind as He hung on the cross. Many would argue that the cross shape is pagan, but the celestial Word of God named it "victory over death and dying" for a great reason.

In your birth sky, the location of the Moon and its interpretation can be ascertained through the accuracy of our computer program. The Moon, called Levanah in Hebrew, meaning "the shining one," is the light that rules the night and is the most varied light of the heavens. It changes shape, brightness, and location every day of the month. It shows variation and possibly where you need to be more faithful, giving you the potential to strengthen—or even excel in—those areas through diligence and steadfastness.

The exact location of the Moon can be determined by our computer specifically to within a few yards or meters in the heavens at the time of your birth. Since the Moon moves 12 degrees each day, it is very important that the birth time and birthplace are accurate, if at all possible. If you did not enter the time and location of your birth, the program will, by default, give the data according to noon IT (Israel Time) in Jerusalem for the birth date.


The Moon's message is almost as revealing as the Sun's, regarding where you are to shine. The Moon shows where you can potentially be your best, but you will need to focus on it and stay faithful. The Moon's message can also unveil what you are to guard against. This can be very important information and the decan will spotlight particular aspects of it.

As the Moon was located in Crux for you, you may be one of those chosen to lay it all down for the cause of the King. Perhaps instead of physically dying for Him, it may be a call to sacrificially give your all on a continual basis, persevering for as long as you possibly can. The Moon can also show where you need more faithfulness, so be strong and sacrifice for the right reasons.

Be not weary in well doing. Do not sacrifice just for the people; but do it as you would for Jesus.

Mercury

The planet Mercury was named after the Roman god who was a messenger. The Hebrew name for this planet is *Kovah Chammah*, meaning "the Sun's messenger." Mercury always travels close to the Sun, and the location of Mercury in your birth sky will show the messianic message that you can carry and champion.



Meaning

Level One

- Mercury, the messenger planet, resides in Cancer, the sheepfold.
- Zodiacal pictures of Cancer should be a sheepfold where animals were protected and kept from harm.
- This shows that you are an encourager and exhorter; your passion makes you a lasting friend.

Mercury, the word of Messiah, dwelling in Cancer, the protective pastor constellation, shows a strong word of authority for overseeing and protecting. It is how the shepherd speaks to the sheep. Your word of Messiah is to protect and warn the sheep and keep them close at hand and wary of wolves. It is protective encouragement.

Level Two

Cancer faces Leo and shows that the sheepfold is guarded by the Lion. Speaking words of protective warnings for the people around you takes boldness. This is a strong pastoral word.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

When the inference is that the Sun, Moon, or planet was "in" the decan, it actually is located in the major constellation on the ecliptic path. Each major constellation has three accompanying constellations to amplify its message. The first one-third segment of the ecliptic arc in the major constellation is reserved for the first decan to tell its story, the middle segment of the ecliptic is where the second decan is recognized, and the last one-third segment is related to the third decan of that major constellation.

The major constellation of Cancer has the amplifying signs of Ursa Minor, Ursa Major, and Argo. Each decan has contributing information to help interpret Cancer and its meaning. When the Sun, Moon, or planet is located within Cancer, these decans will provide additional details and specific interpretations.

Cancer is usually misunderstood because its common picture of a crab in the heavens does not agree with the meaning of any of its star names. More accurately, it should be a corral, sheepfold, or cattle fold where animals are kept and protected. The actual word "cancer" does mean "to hold onto," but not like the claws of a crab. The star names show that it is a place of protection, e.g., a holding pen or a corral for animals. One of its star names also means "to hold onto," and other ancient star names indicate animals, such as sheep, goats, and especially donkeys. Two of the stars are Asellus Boreas, aka Asellus Borealis (northern donkey), and Asellus Australis (southern donkey).

The meaning of Cancer and its stars is "to hold onto" as in a sheltering place for animals or a holding pen. The decans corroborate this because all three speak of abiding in shelter and protection. So Cancer is a sheepfold or cattle fold, encircling and protecting those who are waiting for the coming of the king (Leo), the next constellation. The meaning of this is explained in the context of the constellation and then confirmed by the decans.

The messianic messages in the context of the major constellations show a savior (Virgo) was sacrificed (Libra) and wounded (Scorpio), but then he overcame (Sagittarius). This same redeemer was the sacrifice for sin (Capricorn), raised up to give the Holy Spirit (Aquarius) to bind Satan (Pisces), and be empowered over him (Aries). He is returning with rage (Taurus) to defeat Satan and call his bride (Gemini) to give her the hope of the kingdom (Cancer) from the king on high (Leo).

This indicates that the message of Cancer is to be the one who encircles, holds onto, and protects. In the context of all the constellations telling the story, Cancer is the promise of the coming kingdom and eternal life, so hold onto it. Howbeit, in Christological interpretation, this shows the messianic character of hope, encouragement, and optimism. The decans show the hope for the millennial kingdom in Ursa Minor; eternal life in Ursa Major; and Paradise in Argo. When we see these constellations in the heavens, we are reminded of our inheritance in the coming kingdom. The interesting thing about this is that Ursa Major and Ursa Minor are two of the most recognized constellations in the whole celestial cathedral, and yet Cancer, the major constellation, is hardly visible compared to those around it.

Also, in the whole ecliptic circle, the constellation of Cancer has the least number of degrees assigned to it. The major constellations are not all 30 degrees as astrological tables inaccurately assume. Actually the Sun abides in Cancer only 22 days per year,

making it the smallest constellation on the ecliptic. So this says "if you want to see this, you had better pay attention." In other words, you have to make sure you do not miss it. This is the message of hope, holding on to that which you cannot see. You have been called to be an optimist who is full of hope.

The actual visibility of Cancer is pale in comparison to other constellations around it, which means you need to keep focusing on it to not miss it. The message of the sheepfold, Cancer, is about the hope of the coming kingdom and protecting those who are under your care till His coming.

Ursa Minor is the first decan of Cancer and gives greater details about the picture being a corral or cattle pen because it is a sheepfold, as is Ursa Major. Ursa means "bear" and Minor means "the smaller one" and Major means "the larger one;" yet star names show that these are cattle folds or sheep pens and certainly not bears. Why they are called bears is puzzling, especially since bears do not have tails as long as the ones in the typical pictures of these constellations. It is understandable that the ancient stargazers missed this because the message of Ursa Major and Minor is about the hope of the messianic kingdom and they did not have a clue about that, so they replaced it with a false figure. The only other reasonable explanation for both Ursa Major and Minor to be called bears is the mispronunciation of Hebrew and Persian words. Nevertheless, the point is these are cattle folds to show protection and hope, not bears.

The second decan (ecliptic segment) of Cancer is Ursa Major. There are two stars, Asellus Boreas, aka Asellus Borealis (northern donkey), and Asellus Australis (southern donkey) in this area of Cancer to emphasize the care of animals or, as we see Christologically, the care of people and the provisions of a pastor and shepherd.


Ursa Major is also known as the Big Dipper in the western world. It is the large one with the long handle (or the tail of the bear); but particularly because this is a cattle fold, the long string of stars represents the gate of the cattle fold. This constellation is larger than Ursa Minor and therefore shows that "many are called," while Ursa Minor shows "few are chosen." This is a strong portrayal of a compassionate, protecting shepherd and is the major messianic message of Ursa Major.

Mercury was in the second segment of the ecliptic arc of Cancer in your birth sky. This is the decan assigned to Ursa Major to speak its messianic message. It is a testimony of hope and reassurance of our inheritance. As Mercury is the planet that shows the utterance giftings as a messenger, this indicates that you are to be a supreme encourager.

A fitly spoken word is as apples of gold in pictures of silver, making the heart glad and encouraged. To be encouraged means to put courage "inside" someone. Your words are powerful. Make sure to use them for encouragement, optimism, and hope. An ounce of encouragement in the hard times is worth more than a pound of praise after victory.

Venus

Venus' Hebrew name is *Nogah*, which means "bright" and "splendorous." The Roman name was given to this planet to honor their goddess of beauty and passion. In this sense, the mythological name still carries the messianic message of passion and love. The messianic message of Venus is very simple—the love of Christ.



Level One

- Venus, the planet of passion and love, is located in Leo, the bold lion.
- Leo is a bold lion as Proverbs 28:1 says, "the righteous are bold as a lion."
- This shows that you are bold about those you love; you wear your heart on your sleeve.

Venus, the passionate planet, residing in Leo, the bold king, shows a love for the Lion of the tribe of Judah. You have an undying devotion to the King and Judge. It should not be too unusual to find you in deep worship or devotion to Israel.

Level Two

Venus is the second planet from the Sun, passionately showing your devotion and adoration. Venus in Leo, depending upon its proximity to Regulus, the King star, or to Denebola, the Judge, can give an allegiance to your worship. Many people with the Sun or planets in the area of Denebola, the Judge, want retribution as part of the Lord's coming. We love the King and we should love the Judge too.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

When it is said that the Sun, Moon, or planet is "in" a particular decan, it is actually located in the major constellation on the ecliptic path. Each major constellation has three accompanying constellations (decans) to amplify its message. The first one-third segment of the ecliptic arc in the major constellation is reserved for the first decan to tell its story; the middle segment of the ecliptic is where the second decan is recognized; and the last one-third segment is related to the third decan of that major constellation.

In the major constellation of Leo, there are three decans: Hydra, Crater, and Corvus. Decans are amplifiers of the major constellation's message and give it greater detail and specificity. In your birth sky, you have at least one planetoid in this constellation of Leo, and

Leo represents the King of kings. You are the head and not the tail.

Leo is the completion of the story of the mazzaroth. The messianic messages in the context of the 12 major constellations show a savior (Virgo) was sacrificed (Libra) and wounded (Scorpio), and yet overcame (Sagittarius). This same redeemer was the sacrifice for sin (Capricorn), raised up to give the Holy Spirit (Aquarius) to bind Satan (Pisces) and be empowered over him (Aries). He is returning with rage (Taurus) to defeat Satan and call His bride (Gemini) to give her the hope of the kingdom (Cancer) from the King on high (Leo). This is the consummation of the story of a king, who after being wounded, returns to wreak havoc and vengeance on his enemy. For those who will rise up and claim their potential in Messiah, Leo displays kingly, ruling characteristics and an aggressive attitude to attack evil.

The message of the constellation of Leo communicates across all cultures and languages because it is in pictures. In all cultures, the lion is the king of beasts, so it is readily recognizable that this is about the king and his rulership. He is the ruler; no one rouses a lion from his nap so he rests peacefully, knowing that nothing will attack him because he is the king of beasts. This shows security and confidence.

Leo has several major stars including Regulus and Denebola that are close to the ecliptic path. Regulus means "the king" in Greek but "the one who treads under foot" in Hebrew. Regulus is famous in its triple conjunction with Jupiter in the birth sky of Jesus of Nazareth. This was the king planet, Jupiter, in conjunction with the king star, Regulus, in the king constellation of Leo; and it signaled the magi that the promised king of the Judeans had been born. Jupiter retrograded during this time and announced three times that the king of the Judeans had been born. Leo was known as the constellation of the Judeans (i.e., Leo, the lion of the tribe of Judah) as Daniel had taught the astronomers in Babylon and Persia. When the magi arrived, they asked, "Where is He who is born king of the Judeans?" Denebola, the star usually pictured farther to the rear (to the east) of the lion's body, in the hind quarters, means "the judge is coming." It is located in the decan of Corvus, the avenging raven. These two stars show the coming of Messiah as King (Regulus) and Judge (Denebola).

Leo's decans are Hydra, Corvus, and Crater. They deliver a serious message that gives the details of what Leo speaks and how he rules. While Leo speaks of ruling and judgment, Hydra conveys domination over Satan, Corvus portrays the pouring out of God's wrath on men, and Crater spells out the punishment of wicked sons of evil. Their messages spotlight Leo, the king, as he is beginning his reign and ridding the world of evil and corruption. It is a word of vengeance, retribution, and retaliation. Each decan shows how the king will rule. Interpreted Christologically, these messianic traits and potentials are resident within you to rule, reign, and wipe out evil. You are called as a warrior to represent a returning king (Leo) who was wounded in the last battle but is fearless and ferocious in His battle against evil. Each of the decans will give more insight into how you are to reign and what you are to attack.

These violent Christological depictions seem to be disappearing in the lifestyle of today's Christian. This is because the called out have been pacified by pastors who do not carry a staff and a sling. The constellation of Leo, more than all others, shows the vengeance side of God's passion. Matthew 11:12 still indicates that the kingdom of heaven is a violent one and the violent take it by force. Contemporary Christianity has been so diluted that it downplays true aggressors in the kingdom of God. Hear this word spoken to you: you are an aggressor.

The first decan in Leo is Hydra. This means that the planetoid was actually in the first part of the body of the lion, directly under his feet. The star Regulus is also called, "the treading under foot" because the paws of the lion are on the head of Hydra, a huge water serpent. The serpent is the figurative representative of evil and biblically this refers to Satan and the kingdom of darkness. Hydra is a long constellation that stretches beneath Leo, through Virgo, and into Libra underneath the ecliptic path of the Sun. It shows that evil has existed a long time and was underneath Virgo to try to seize and kill the redeemer, Libra. Leo, the king, appears ready to pounce on Hydra's head, kill the serpent, tear it to pieces, and eat it.


Hydra shows the messianic trait of ruling over Satan and his minions. To have them underfoot means to exercise authority over them. You need to exercise authority over Satan and make him and his kingdom bow down. Hydra represents punishment that will be inflicted directly on Satan when the lion gets its neck in his clutches. The neck has the principle star Cor Hydrae (aka Alphard), meaning "the heart of the serpent," and contributes to the understanding that this is how you control a serpent: grab it by the neck and then rend it into pieces. This means that you are to actively grab evil and destroy it, not to coexist with it.

Venus, the planet that shows passion and compassion, was in the first portion of Leo, the king, on the day of your birth. This is the portion of Leo's ecliptic path assigned to the decan Hydra to testify of its messianic message. Hydra is the accursed serpent that is being killed and devoured. This signifies extreme violence against evil and a passion to see retribution.

Venus is also the second planet from the Sun, and the number 2 according to scriptural numerics represents "establishment." You will be established as you fulfill your calling to stamp out evil, and you have the boldness of a lion to do so.

Mars

Mars' Hebrew name is *Madim*, meaning "red." It is the red planet and red represents fervor—what you will fight for, bleed for, and potentially what you will die for. The messianic message of Mars is this aspect of "Yeshua the Warrior" being manifested through you.



Meaning

Level One

- Mars, the red planet of fervor and zeal, is positioned in Leo, the bold lion.
- Leo is a bold lion as Proverbs 28:1 says, "the righteous are bold as a lion."
- This shows that you fight for what you believe in and that you are a "fighter," not a "flighter."

Mars, the warrior, residing in Leo, the bold ruler, means a bold warrior for the King and Judge. You are called to be fearless in the face of danger and to represent the King in matters where others would shrink.

Level Two

You should not be afraid of demons; you should study them. This means also that the anointing to do battle against them is yours. You are one of the warriors that God has put in the kingdom. Not everybody likes soldiers, but people who are rescued by them like them enough to make up for it.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

When it is said that the Sun, Moon, or planet is "in" a particular decan, it is actually located in the major constellation on the ecliptic path. Each major constellation has three accompanying constellations (decans) to amplify its message. The first one-third segment of the ecliptic arc in the major constellation is reserved for the first decan to tell its story; the middle segment of the ecliptic is where the second decan is recognized; and the last one-third segment is related to the third decan of that major constellation.

In the major constellation of Leo, there are three decans: Hydra, Crater, and Corvus. Decans are amplifiers of the major constellation's message and give it greater detail and specificity. In your birth sky, you had at least one planetoid in this constellation of Leo, and Leo represents the King of kings. You are the head and not the tail.

Leo is the completion of the story of the mazzaroth. The messianic messages in the context of the 12 major constellations show a savior (Virgo) was sacrificed (Libra) and wounded (Scorpio), and yet overcame (Sagittarius). This same redeemer was the sacrifice for sin (Capricorn), raised up to give the Holy Spirit (Aquarius) to bind Satan (Pisces) and be empowered over him (Aries). He is returning with rage (Taurus) to defeat Satan and call His bride (Gemini) to give her the hope of the kingdom (Cancer) from the King on high (Leo). This is the consummation of the story of a king, who after being wounded, returns to wreak havoc and vengeance on his enemy. For those who will rise up and claim their potential in Messiah, Leo displays kingly, ruling characteristics and an aggressive attitude to attack evil.

The message of the constellation of Leo communicates across all cultures and languages because it is in pictures. In all cultures, the lion is the king of beasts, so it is readily recognizable that this is about the king and his rulership. He is the ruler; no one rouses a lion from his nap so he rests peacefully, knowing that nothing will attack him because he is the king of beasts. This shows security and confidence.

Leo has several major stars including Regulus and Denebola that are close to the ecliptic path. Regulus means "the king" in Greek but "the one who treads under foot" in Hebrew. Regulus is famous in its triple conjunction with Jupiter in the birth sky of Jesus of Nazareth. This was the king planet, Jupiter, in conjunction with the king star, Regulus, in the king constellation, Leo; and it signaled the magi that the promised king of the Judeans had been born. Jupiter retrograded during this time and announced three times that the king of the Judeans had been born. Leo was known as the constellation of the Judeans (i.e., Leo, the lion of the tribe of Judah) as Daniel had taught the astronomers in Babylon and Persia. When the magi arrived, they asked, "Where is He who is born king of the Judeans?" Denebola, the star usually pictured farther to the rear (to the east) of the lion's body, in the hind quarters, means "the judge is coming." It is located in the decan of Corvus, the avenging raven. These two stars show the coming of Messiah as King (Regulus) and Judge (Denebola).

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Leo's second decan is Crater, the cup of wrath and vengeance. This is typically illustrated as a pitcher or an urn firmly attached to Hydra, the accursed sea serpent. It signifies the outpouring of wrath on the serpent and over evil, indicating you are called to be a serious warrior and cupbearer of the Lord.

The cup imagery is helpful in understanding the messianic message. There are two cups of the Lord. One is the cup of communion and the other is the cup of His wrath (Crater). The communion (common union) cup is of love, forgiveness, and obedience. The other is the cup of rebellion, selfishness, and disobedience. Which cup will you choose? The cup of wrath poured out on the wicked is a common theme through the Old and New Testament prophets. It is a sign of His wrath and severe punishment. You are a cupbearer sharing the choices of either cup.

This indicates that you might be a good street preacher to help people decide which cup they should choose. This is a good portrayal of "in your face" love and someone who will not back down. Like the major constellation of Leo, the bold lion, charge on.


Strong words of judgment and conviction are rare functions in the body of Christ. If more existed, maybe sin would not flourish. Be bold to speak the blessings of communion and

the damnation of God's wrath.

Mars, the red planet, was in the middle third of the constellation of Leo, the bold one, on the day of your birth. This place on the ecliptic is allotted to the decan of Crater to testify. Crater is the cup of judgment, either of communion or wrath. Mars, the warrior, residing in this location intensifies and magnifies your spiritual aggressiveness in witnessing. This is not wimpy witnessing but a bold reminder of the wrath of God.

This takes courage to do, and if more would do so, there would be a lot more confrontations with evil and destruction in our families and congregations. Be a bold cupbearer for the Lord.

Meaning

Level One Level Two Level Three In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

The picture for the constellation named Sagittarius, Latin for "archer," is that of a man upon a horse shooting an arrow at the Scorpion (Scorpio). It depicts the reprisal of the wounded conqueror and clearly demonstrates the messianic attribute of an overcomer. This also shows some vengeance as the archer is shooting at the one who wounded him previously (in the story of Scorpio). Most zodiacs have him as a centaur, a half-man and half-horse figure, but this is just a mythological addition to the initial celestial truth of the consummate warrior. Simply put, a horseman shooting a bow was perhaps, at some other time, the most feared and powerful warrior of all. This whole constellation speaks of someone who never quits.

The three decans of Sagittarius are Lyra, Ara, and Draco. These are the amplifiers that contribute to, explain, and intensify the meaning of the overcoming warrior and the defeat of Satan. Lyra is a harp/eagle, Ara is a funeral pyre, and Draco is the dragon cast down. Make no mistake; any decan in any part of Sagittarius shows a warrior who will not quit and who has the attitude of vengeance.

The second decan of Sagittarius, occupying the middle one-third segment of the constellation's ecliptics arc, is relegated to Ara. The constellation of Ara is an ominous picture of a funeral pyre. It is depicted as an upside down altar of fire, and since it is a southern constellation, it appears to be pouring this on Earth. Its message is clear: it is the judgment of God being poured out upon Earth. The Hebrews called it the finishing place, the Greeks called it the altar of cursing, and the Egyptians called it the place of bruising for punishment. It is referenced in the Bible in the books of Revelation and Isaiah as the place of banishment and punishment for the wicked.

This very stout constellation with its sober meaning lends its interpretation to the decan of Ara as well. The decan is typically in the torso and body area of the archer on the ecliptic path, and it shows vengeance being executed upon the cursed. Not often does the vernacular of modern day Christ followers allow for such judgment, but the wrath of God is real and greatly to be feared.

The Christology of Ara means pronouncing severe judgment and curses on the wicked as well as testifying of the supremacy of victory yet to come. There are no evident star names with Ara, so the ancient names and pictures are the best reference. They all agree that this is a place of judgment. And so, the Christological interpretation is judgment on the wicked. This may open your eyes to see who you are really made to be without the filters of religion.

Earth in the decan of Ara is one of the great inner secrets of celestial interpretation. This orientation of the Earth and its interpretation is known only to a very few seekers of celestial secrets. It is found in the Bible and also in Manley Hall's writings. The Earth's celestial location for the purpose of Christological interpretations is 180 degrees across from the Sun. The way it is interpreted is to view the location from the perspective of the Sun. In other words, divide the ecliptic circle into two parts and then read the opposite side.

Dividing the circle is a principle of interpretation that David used in Psalm 19:5 and 6 where he divided the mazzaroth (the 12 major constellations on the ecliptic path) into two parts by dissecting it between Sagittarius (the strong man) and Gemini (the bridegroom coming out of his chamber). They are 180 degrees apart from each other. Incidentally these two places

are where the ecliptic circle crosses the Milky Way and orients the center of the heavens at the end of the bow of Sagittarius. Also, dividing the circle for interpretation purposes is clearly seen in Revelation 12:3 where the reference is made to the tail of the dragon (Draco) casting down one-third of the stars to the Earth. This divides the circle on the face of the deep into thirds. We also know that God divided the ecliptic circle into 12 different parts. So, it is a scriptural approach to divide celestial circles for interpretation of deeper meanings.

Earth is interpreted as it is viewed from the Sun. Since this is from the Sun's perspective, it relates an inner secret of how Jesus looks at you. It is viewed heliocentrically (from the Sun as center) instead of geocentrically (from the Earth as center). The Earth is the third planet (rock) from the Sun and has a meaning connected to the number 3. The number 3 indicates "completeness." (There are groupings of three strewn across the pages of the Bible, e.g., the Trinity, spirit/soul/body, and three days and three nights in the grave.) The interpretation is read the way Jesus sees you in your completeness and perfection.

Earth in the decan of Ara means that you are inwardly the one who has the vengeance of the Lord in your heart. To hate evil is a big part of you and to see the Lord's wrath poured out on the world is one of your great desires.

This kind of interpretation is not always popular in contemporary Christian circles where the majority of Christ-like attributes that are recognized are pastoral instead of prophetic. Rest assured there is a very dynamic side of the Lord that includes exacting punishment on enemies of the kingdom of God. This position of the Earth indicates your completeness and fulfillment. You feel fulfilled when evil is punished.

Ceres

Ceres is the largest of the asteroids orbiting around the Sun between Mars and Jupiter. Everyone agrees that at one time it was a planet. (There will be more about this in level 2 and level 3.) We again are dealing with astronomy and not astrology. Ceres, of all the planets, holds a mystique about it—mainly, what caused it to explode. The Hebrew name is *Rahab* and it is mentioned by name in two separate places in the Bible (Psalm 89:10 and Isaiah 51:9). The location of Rahab, or Ceres, in your profile shows the possible places of attack or weaknesses. Hence, it shows what you need to study and guard against—areas commonly attacked, possible strongholds of pride, or even potential blind spots.

Focusing on Ceres is one of the issues of the levels 2 and 3.

Meaning

Level One

Ceres is a small planetoid that revolves round the Sun between Mars and Jupiter. It is the largest of a belt of asteriods that most astronomers believe was previously a planet before it exploded or was bombed by another asteroid. Much to the surprise of many, it is mentioned in the Bible (e.g., Isaiah 51:19 and Psalm 89:10) and is called Rahab or Rakab. This is a *major* piece of the whole puzzle when reading planets and locations. Our computer program's accuracy has NASA reconsidering its ephemerides. It's location and meaning requires more explanation and is given at level 2 along with the interpretations of Uranus and Neptune.

Level Two

Ceres, the unknown planet, residing in Capricorn, the sacrificer, shows a need to know more about the rights of others: to give up a "right to be right" and be accommodating to others rather than needing to be right.

See how Capricorn is divided into two parts? It is very important to see where this break lies. Learning to do this for yourself or going to level 3 to discover the specific location of Ceres is very important.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

There are three decans relating to the constellation of Capricorn: Sagitta, the arrow; Aquila, the eagle, and Delphinus, the living fish. Each decan adds to and amplifies the meaning of Capricorn. Sagitta, the arrow, shows the implement of the sacrifice of the goat; Aquila, the eagle, pictured as falling out of the air, relates to the actual sacrifice; and Delphinus, the living fish, communicates being raised from the dead (or living after being a sacrifice).

Capricorn itself is an interesting figure. It is half-goat and half-fish, clearly a nonexistent creature but one construed in the mind of God to communicate the death of the goat and the resurrected life of the fish. The whole constellation is composed of sacrificial beings that are willing to lay down their lives as a sacrifice for those who are suffering. It is typified in Scripture as the sacrificial goat that gave his life for the forgiveness of sins in the Old Testament. It also profiles the celestial messiah who would willingly lay down his life as a substitute for others.


The first and second decans of Capricorn—Sagitta and Aquila—are connected in meaning and have the same Christological implication of being a willing sacrifice. Sagitta, the arrow, is typically pictured as actually touching Aquila, the eagle, in ancient depictions of the zodiac. This means that the arrow piercing the eagle is the action communicated, but this shows a willing sacrifice, not just one being killed. This communicates the highest form of love, that of laying down your life for others.

Sagitta and Aquila are allotted the first and second one-third portions of the ecliptic path in Capricorn. Sagitta, the arrow, is shown as being in flight and not connected to a bow. It is aimed at and communicates the piercing of Aquila, the eagle. The eagle is falling out of the sky, shown by the fact that his head is pointed downward toward the ecliptic path. This means that the eagle has been pierced by the arrow and is dying. The arrow is the implement and the eagle is the target. The star names in both of these constellations mean that a willing sacrifice has been made.

Ceres, the small planetoid orbiting between Mars and Jupiter, represents the fifth position away from the Sun. The number 5 means "grace," and since Ceres is not visible with the naked eye, this shows that you need to increase the scrutiny in your life for this aspect of sacrificial love and service to be manifested. The fact that Ceres is in this position indicates that the power and potential to live this way is certainly resident within you; however, for this messianic virtue to mature into full fruition, you will need grace and to be continually focused on being sacrificial.

Jupiter

Jupiter is the head god of the pantheon of Rome; his name was Zeus to the Greeks. The planet Jupiter is the largest planet by far and namesake-wise, it holds a regal position even among the other planets. It shows the leadership and courage of Yeshua.



Level One

- Jupiter, the leadership planet, is situated in Virgo, the kingdom builder.
- Virgo is the constellation of the visionary and kingdom builder.
- This means you have leadership ability for your causes and beliefs. Virgo shows a nonconformist and could indicate leading an unusual cause, but you have the

strength to do so.

Jupiter shows leadership in advancing a cause. Jupiter, as the largest planet, shows the leadership attributes of Messiah; and being in Virgo, the kingdom-advancing constellation, shows that you are a point person to advance a cause. Do not be dissuaded if there is opposition to you in this. Most people are wounded in the areas of their giftedness.

Level Two

Depending upon the location of Jupiter in this large constellation, the meaning is quite varied. If Jupiter is high in the head, it shows you have a mind for leadership. In mid body, it means that you have leadership in entrepreneurial endeavors, and lower in the legs indicates that you will travel to advance your cause. This is a very powerful portrayal and will be a dominant portion of your character.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

Centaurus occupies the second decan (ecliptic segment) in Virgo. This is the place where the traits of Centaurus are shown in your Christological profile. The constellation of Centaurus is located below the left hand of the Virgin. So, as Coma is on the right hand signifying blessings from the promised seed of Virgo, now Centaurus is on the left hand showing His sacrifice and His vindication yet to come.

Be mindful; the decan of Centaurus was also the location of the Sun in the birth sky of Jesus of Nazareth. Two stars in this portion of Virgo have great relevance to the meaning of the decan: the bright star called Spica shows versatility as well as ability; another star, Al Mureddin (now called Vindemiatrix), means "who shall come down" or "who shall have dominion."

The picture of the constellation of Centaurus in most western zodiacs is a half-man-half-horse, a centaur, piercing a victim with a spear. However, it would simply be a man riding upon a horse and carrying a spear if mythology had not pasted a nephilim-based creature over it. It is a most imposing figure that lies deep in the southern portion of the sky, so it is not seen from the upper regions of the northern hemisphere. The star named Toliman (aka Rigil Kent or Rigil Kentaurus) declares Centaurus' messianic virtue.

Toliman means "the heretofore and the hereafter" and opens the understanding of a dual fulfillment—both here and hereafter. Regarding the "here," Centaurus is called the "sin offering" in the Hebrew language. And yet, the picture is of a guy on a horse piercing a victim. So some have related this to Christ as a sin offering and others to Him as the ultimate warrior who will finish the fight, aka Armageddon. Jesus may have been the sacrificial offering for sin, but He is also the one coming back to inflict punishment on evil and sin.


As it relates to your own birth sky profile, this is not a passive portrayal. Whether it is the Sun or Moon or planet in the decan of Centaurus, it shows you are proactive. And being within Virgo, the kingdom taker, shows that you were made for commitment and have what it takes to go the distance. Messianic virtues include being merciful and just, as well as having an attitude of vindication. To his enemies, Centaurus is a formidable foe.

Jupiter in this area of the ecliptic shows that you have definite leadership ability in taking the kingdom in spiritual warfare. Jupiter is the largest planet and shows the leadership you are called to perform. Centaurus is a fierce warrior who has the ability to finish the fight.

You are called to be a bold leader in spiritual warfare.

Saturn

Saturn's ancient, mystical Hebrew name of *Shabbati* helps in identifying the Christology of this, the seventh planet from the Sun. Interestingly, the root word of *Shabbati* means the "Sabbath"—the seventh day of the week. Saturn with all its glorious rings and beauty shows the consummate messianic contribution of your life in faithfulness and service. This is the hill to die on!



Meaning

Level One

- Saturn, the seventh planet of faithfulness and service, is in Gemini, the twins.
- Gemini has two major stars: one named for Messiah the King and the other for Messiah the Redeemer.
- The location of Saturn in this constellation is very crucial in its meaning. This will show which aspect of faithfulness and service you will embrace more—the righteous ruler or the selfless servant. This also means you can do both or either, making you a faithful friend regardless of age, race, religion or social background.

Saturn, the seventh planet, residing in Gemini, the well balanced shepherd/king, shows the faithfulness and steadiness of wisdom in dealing with all. As Saturn moves more slowly, this could probably be a trait manifested in later years—that God has ordained you to be a source of wisdom both to young and old, or to rich or poor, or to the right or wrong.

Level Two

In the Gemini constellation, more than most others, the specific location of the Sun or any planet is extremely important. On the right side (as you view it) the star named Castor in Latin is the bright star in the head of the King/Bridegroom/Conqueror. On the left side is the star Pollux, so named in Latin, which is the side of the Redeemer/Bride and Rescuer. The position of the planet within the constellation is crucial to obtaining the deeper meaning. There are star names that give extra meaning when the locations are determined too.

This is extremely important because it can show you where you need to be faithful.

Level Three

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Decans are amplifiers of major constellations and the decans of Gemini are Lepus, Canis Major and Canis Minor. Each decan contribute to the whole messianic message of Gemini. To really appreciate Gemini and to understand the mysteries of it, you must learn the lessons of the decans.

Gemini is one of more famous constellations because it is easy to find. Its ancient Coptic (Egyptian) name as well as its Hebrew name means, "the united." The more modern name of Gemini means "twins" in Latin and derives its meaning from the twin stars in Gemini. It is the picture of two people. In some zodiacs, it is a man and woman and in others, they are two young boys sitting down, holding weapons but not shooting them. It appears that they are rulers and warriors, and yet they are not presently involved in war.

The two main stars of Gemini are named after the sons of Jupiter in mythology: Castor and Pollux in Latin, or Apollo and Hercules in Greek. The star names give much greater details about the actual meaning of this constellation. The brighter one on the right side, from our perspective, is called Castor, meaning "the judge" and "ruler;" the slightly dimmer star to the left is called Pollux, "the redeemer who comes to suffer." The names of other stars in the constellation mean "treading under foot," "the one appointed to rule," and "the redeemer afflicted." The meaning is unity and shows the twin aspects of Messiah as

Ruler/Redeemer, Son of God/Son of man, and the Lion/Lamb. The message of unity speaks of being amenable and negotiable, well balanced and not an extremist. Being a unifier means being forgiving and reconciling.

Although the common name attributed to this constellation deals with twins, the actual meaning of the two dominant stars is "the united." This is the messianic message continually portrayed through this constellation. It shows the united messianic characteristics of being the ruler, the judge, and the rescuer. It means that Messiah is all things to all men and has a definite inference of being well balanced. The specific decan the Sun, Moon, or planet abides in will indicate if you are more endowed as a ruler, judge, rescuer, or a combination of these attributes. There are strong implications that this is an arbitrator or one who brings things and people together.

The decans assigned to amplify the meaning of Gemini are Lepus, Canis Major and Canis Minor. The commonly known, modern pictures of all three decans is under strong influence of mythology, portraying the dogs (Canis Major and Canis Minor) of the hunter (Orion) as killing a rabbit (Lepus). However, while the analogy of attacking and killing is accurate, the star names reveal that the dogs are actually hawks and the rabbit is a snake. The star names show that the name of Canis Major would be the Hawk of Rulership and Canis Minor would be the Hawk of the Redeemer. This is one of the consummate places in the heavens that portrays the Messiah as both King and Redeemer. It is fully shown by the twin stars of Gemini and now we can see how the meaning is derived from the decans as well. Both hawks, unified, are attacking the serpent (aka Lepus), while Orion stomps on it. This presents a three-pronged attack on evil. So the messianic trait of attacking evil is in addition to being a unifier.

The star names are what paint an accurate picture, so we can reconstruct the deeper meanings. As these truths emerge, the messianic characteristics will become clearer. Suffice it to say in summary: Lepus communicates ruling over enemies and keeping them underfoot, Canis Major shows the messianic trait of being the king and ruler, and Canis Minor represents messiah as the rescuer or redeemer.

The third decan assigned to the ecliptic path of Gemini is Canis Minor. The contemporary picture of Canis Minor is a dog, but that comes from Greek mythology. The ancient Egyptian zodiac shows it as a hawk with the body of a man who is attacking a serpent (Lepus) that is being stomped by Orion. The principal star that unveils Canis Minor's true identity is Procyon, meaning "the redeemer." This hawk represents the redeemer, coming to subdue evil and free the oppressed.

The star named Pollux in the constellation of Gemini reiterates the reference to a redeemer. Pollux is in this third segment of Gemini's ecliptic path and its Greek name, Hercules, also means "the strong one who comes to redeem and rescue."

Saturn, the seventh planet from the Sun, was residing in the last portion of the ecliptic arc in Gemini. This is the section allotted for Canis Minor to speak its messianic message. Canis Minor is a hawk attacking a serpent (Lepus) in the ancient Egyptian zodiacs. This displays an intense, aggressive attitude of attacking evil.

The root word for Saturn means "seven," and it holds a great place in the messianic meanings of planets. The number 7 in scriptural numerics indicates "perfection" and "maturity," showing where your service in the kingdom of God can be greatest.


This is an aggressive picture of being a "hawk" for Jesus. This means to always have your eyes open to hunt for the person who needs to hear the word of truth, the gospel of

salvation. This portrayal speaks of aggressive evangelism for people and against evil. This function is often rare in the church. The popular attitude is to coexist with evil and leave it alone if it does not bother you. But a lack of decisive action in this area is the kind of thing that will rot a society. As you are called to walk aggressively against evil, take courage from the message of Gemini, the ruler, and Pollux, the redeemer who labors and suffers.

You are called to subdue evil and not to coexist with it. Be courageous.

Uranus

Uranus, Neptune, and Pluto (if you consider Pluto, which was reclassified as a dwarf planet) are all not visible with the naked eye. This means that either they are not relative to our study or they have a hidden meaning that escapes the naked eye. They possibly show inner sanctum thoughts that perhaps only the person would really know, and they serve as confirmations of things the Holy Spirit shows to you personally. In level 2, other possible meanings are discussed; and in level 3, their exact location is found within the constellations.

Uranus, the hidden planet, residing in Taurus, the redeeming judge, shows your innermost desire for proper judgment and righteous treatment. You are looking forward to the Lord judging the world.

Uranus is also the eighth planet, which numerically indicates a new beginning. It also shows a mellowing or a seasoning since it lingers so long in Taurus. This shows a need for you to engage a new cause that will motivate you to charge. This might indicate something toward the end of your life.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

The three decans of Taurus are Orion, the hunter; Eridanus, the river of judgment; and Auriga, the shepherd. These three constellations give Taurus amplified meaning and very specific messages.

The typical picture of the constellation of Taurus is a charging bull. It is moving rapidly with its head down to indicate it is in attack mode and is pushing hard. The picture is only the front one-third of the bull, but it includes the shoulder, which is noted for the strength. The bull's horns stretch out along the ecliptic path and comprise almost a third of the degree length of the constellation. The star names in Taurus show that it is a leader who is coming to judge and collect the congregations of believers. Two stars whose names mean "the congregated" are located in this brilliant constellation. In mythology the image of the bull was a reem, which was a wild, fierce ox known for its dangerous horns and dominating, untamable nature.

These groups of constellations are among the easiest to identify in the heavens. The belt of Orion is the most recognized star group in the sky. In close proximity are the stars forming the familiar "v" shape that is the nose of Taurus, and the red star that his eye. The famous Pleiades is in the upper shoulder of the bull. The name of that constellation means "the congregation of the judged" and it is the little, Little Dipper-shaped group of seven stars, also called the Seven Sisters in modern astronomy. It is next door to Gemini, the twin stars.

The context of the ecliptic message of Taurus is that the bull is obviously the Messiah who was born in Virgo, suffered in Capricorn, gave the Holy Spirit in Aquarius, bound Satan in Pisces, and will rule over His coming kingdom in Aries. The bull shows the attitude of returning with judgment to be exacted and pronounced on all. Orion, the hunter, shows how the Lord will search to and fro to find His; Eridanus, the river of judgment, has good news for those who believed on Messiah and bad news for those who did not; and lastly, Auriga, the faithful shepherd, shows the love of the Lord to not miss one of His own. Taurus is the beginning of the last group of constellations that tells of the Messiah's second coming and rulership over the earth.

When we say that the Sun, Moon, or planet is "in the decan of," it does not mean that the planetoid was located inside that constellation's boundaries. The planetoids are actually

located within Taurus along the ecliptic path, but that location is reserved for a particular decan to speak and give its message. The first one-third segment of the ecliptic arc of Taurus, from the beginning of the shoulder to mid body is assigned to Orion to amplify the message. The second one-third portion of Taurus' ecliptic arc is dedicated to Eridanus with its message of judgment. This is from mid body to the end of the head. The third segment of the ecliptic in Taurus, basically along the horns of the bull, is reserved for Auriga, the shepherd, to amplify.

All of these decans contribute to the meaning of a determined bull that is coming in rage and cannot be stopped. Christologically, this shows the trait of being determined and courageous with a single-minded focus. The decans will add to this meaning and give more specifics as to the messianic virtue and character they relate.

Being judgmental and opinionated are messianic traits. Oftentimes the idea of being judgmental is negative, but this is not necessarily true. There are many biblical records of bold, fearless spokespersons for the kingdom of God who were very vocal on issues. No one had to wonder what kind of person Jesus of Nazareth was when He turned over the moneychangers' tables and chased the culprits out of the temple. This is the kind of judgment that prophets of old spoke and declared. This was also the example of John the Baptist when he pronounced judgment on Herod for marrying his brother's wife. Just to be upfront, this calling includes being persecuted and rejected as you carry it out.

The third decan of Taurus is associated with Auriga, the shepherd. The typical picture of the constellation of Auriga is a shepherd holding a sheep or goat under his left arm and a sling, or reins, or even a bow and arrow in the other hand. All the names of the constellation agree that this is the shepherd, and yet the picture is not necessarily of a gentle shepherd, but rather one who is aggressively guarding over the flock of the congregation. The five bright stars form a beautiful sheriff's badge, with the bottom right star joining the horn of Taurus with the shepherd's foot.

This figure is perfectly personified by David the shepherd who killed the bear and the lion in order to protect his sheep. This representation does not fit well with the contemporary portrayal of a passive shepherd, but it does fit with the overall persona of Taurus, a raging bull. Auriga is a fighting shepherd, devoted to protecting the sheep in his flock and calling them together to shield them from their enemies.


This decan is basically in the horns of the bull, showing its strength. Auriga is pictured in some zodiacs as holding a pair of reins in his left hand, but the reins may actually represent the sling that David used to kill Goliath. The relationship of the shepherd to Taurus, the charging bull, leaves no doubt about the interpretation that this is a fearless, aggressive shepherd.

Uranus, the eighth planet from the Sun, was abiding in the horns of Taurus the bull in your birth sky. This is in the decan of Taurus that is relegated to Auriga, the protective shepherd. You are called to be a serious protector over those in your care. Be tough on the wolves and on those who prey on the sheep.

The number 8 in scriptural numerics means a "new beginning." This potentially shows how you are to begin anew in the kingdom of God, or what you will be judged for in order to enter the coming kingdom of Jesus Christ on the Earth (the 1,000-year reign), where life will begin anew for those who are worthy. You are called to fight for and protect those under your care. Be diligent to fulfill this calling. It plausibly will be the indicator for your entrance into the millennial kingdom.

Neptune

Uranus, Neptune, and Pluto (if you consider Pluto, which was reclassified as a dwarf planet) are all not visible with the naked eye. This means that either they are not relative to our study or they have a hidden meaning that escapes the naked eye. They possibly show inner sanctum thoughts that perhaps only the person would really know, and they serve as confirmations of things the Holy Spirit shows to you personally. In level 2, other possible meanings are discussed; and in level 3, their exact location is found within the constellations.

Neptune moves very slowly around the ecliptic from Earth's point of view, and the fact that it is barely seeable with the naked eye makes it mysterious and thought provoking. The word "Neptune" is derived from the god of the sea in mythology or the "deep" as the Bible calls it. Neptune calls the deep things out of you; or in other words, its location on the ecliptic shows a deeper level of meaning and importance than something that just meets the eye.

When Neptune is Virgo it shows your deep passion and love of building the kingdom of God; or if in the secular sense, it reveals a deeper passion for success than just meets the eye. Incidentally, Neptune was under the foot of Ophiuchus and on the Scorpion when Yeshua (Jesus) was born. This was the hidden fire in His heart to crush Satan under His foot. It cost Him His life, but He succeeded. The location of Neptune in your birth sky is a hidden secret of your heart and a source of deeper commitment.

Level Three

In interpreting any decan information for your birth sky, always remember the constellation in which it abides. Each decan comprises one-third of the ecliptic path in that constellation. The order of all three decans is significant and the meaning of each one is amazingly specific.

Occupying the first one-third portion of the band width of Virgo is the decan Coma, which means "the desired of all nations." Forget the modern name associated with the constellation, Coma Berenices, and the modern picture of a hank of hair. The true picture, according to star names and history, is a woman holding a child on her lap. Even Shakespeare referred to it as that. The story is the same on the Denderah zodiac of Egypt dated approximately 2300 BC. Without question, this shows the promised child. Apparently, from the very first position on the ecliptic, God does have a son and this was the portrayal of Him being born.

The ancient star names in the constellation of Coma identify the seated woman as "a pure and immaculate virgin," "the virgin who carries," and "who bears." A star name identifies the child as "the Branch." Clearly, the woman is none other than Virgo and the child in Coma (the desired of all nations) is the highly favored and exceedingly blessed coming One (the offspring of Virgo's womb). All of this information factors into giving the decan of Coma the Christological meaning of being extremely favored and a recipient of great grace. This shines great light on the truth of Ephesians where He has called (desired) us to be with Him from before the overthrow of the cosmos (KJV: foundation of the world) and has predestined us to our adoption as His children.

The evidence that Coma possibly housed the star of Bethlehem is huge. Several astronomers from different countries recorded that a new star, or supernova, ignited about the time of Jesus of Nazareth's birth; and this star was visible into His earthly life. This is compelling testimony that He is Messiah. The supernova reportedly appeared in the

constellation of Coma in the head of the child. For this reason, the decan of Coma also carries an indicator of someone of greater ability and favor to shine as a beacon for others. Plus, when Jesus of Nazareth was born, Venus and Mercury were in Virgo and in the decan of Coma. That would have been a beautiful sight!

The star called Zavijavah (aka Zavijaveh or Zavijava) has a word for you too since it is also located in Virgo in the decan of Coma. Its name means "gloriously beautiful," testifying that you are both beautifully and gloriously made.

Planets located high in the head of Virgo show mental giftedness. He made you the head and not the tail. Regardless of the planet, Sun, or Moon in this position of the ecliptic, it shows extreme favor. This is quite an impressive place showing where God will have mercy and where He has judgment. He has blessed you with great grace and favor, and your life should display an abundance of thankfulness for those blessings.

Neptune stays in the same constellation for approximately 14 years and therefore its message could warrant deep, extended consideration in your life. This is a message that will not go away; you are expected to know it. Since Neptune is one of the planets that cannot be seen with the naked eye, the interpretation may be something that no one knows but you.

Neptune is also the ninth planet from the Sun, and the numeric significance of 9 is "completely complete" and "judgment." Having Neptune in Coma is an indication that you will find completeness in being a kingdom builder and somewhat of a nonconformist. This may be the final area of judgment on you, so be thankful for the abundance of grace on your life and develop your abilities.

Be bold to exercise your abilities to bring to pass the change that is needed. Responding to ability equals responsibility.

If you are like many we hear from, you will be amazed at the accuracy of this interpretation of your birth sky and how it emphasizes your importance to God, the Creator of the heavens. Your messianic potential is a gift that requires the highest stewardship. As you stand before the great I Am, we hope to hear, "Well done, good and faithful servant."
